Hydraulic Rescue/Extrication Tools

Questions received from JMI-Edison 12/05/16

Question: 1

The specifications for the tools are not very clear, as they discuss wanting hydraulic rescue tools with hoses and portable power units and then in the product description section, it discusses battery technology. So it is unclear on whether the end-user wants a wet hydraulic system with hoses and power units or EDraulics with Lithium-ion battery technology.

Response: It is the intent of the Guam Fire Department to purchase EDraulic Extrication Tool Set. See attached "Amendment 2"

Question: 2

There is a description in the specification for each line item of the tools that calls for the tools to operate at 131 feet underwater, that is not possible for any hydraulic rescue tools.

Question: 3

In terms of the on-site training. I would like to know from Guam Fire Department the following:

How many days of training is required?
How many students in the training?

Who will be responsible to provide cars or trucks or vehicles to do extrication training, as we will require multiple vehicles each day of training. We cannot do training on one car. Depending on the number of students and days, we will need a minimum of 4 cars per day.

Who will provide the training area?

Who will provide the location for the cars that are to be cut as there will be metal debris and broken glass and if there is fluids in the cars then possible Haz-Mat materials.

Who is responsible for the clean up and disposal of the vehicles?

Response: Because the rescue units are already familiar and have been using the same type of rescue tools as specified, training will only need to happen for approximately 30 personnel and should only take one day to educate those attending on the maintenance and upkeep of the units being procured. Training does not have to be hands on utilizing a vehicle a vehicle etc. Training can be performed at the respective stations of the units receiving the tools.


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
