Entry fee is \$3 for adults and \$2 for non-UOG students and senior citizens, while UOG students get in for free. Tournament tickets will be available.

It starts at 7 p.m. Friday with the Tritons facing the defending champions of the tournament, the Dodgers, at the Triple J Baseball Complex at Okkodo High School. There will be opening ceremonies to include a ceremonial first pitch on Friday night. All games will be 7 innings.

The tournament also will feature the Amigos and the Pirates. It will feature single games on Friday nights and two or three games on Sundays for four weekends in late January and early February.

The Dodgers defeated the Guam Junior Nationals 13-3 in the championship game in the last invitational

tournament. The Amigos finished in third place. The Pirates are the new team in the tournament.

The Tritons finished in last place but used that experience as both a wake-up call and springboard into a successful re-entry into the Guam Major League, coming within two games of a late-season run at the pennant.

"We are excited and also ready for this tournament," said Tritons head coach Roke Alcantara Jr. "We just came off a season and a championship series and although the holidays were a much-needed break, we

are back to work."

Alcantara said he's excited to see what his latest acquisition, Dominic Pangelinan, will bring to the team. Pangelinan hails from a quality junior college program and can play anywhere on the field, he said.

"I think we will be better than last time. We have more experience and now two seasons under our belts, so we should be better," he said.
