CONTRACT TERMS AND CONDITIONS
GSA-014-26
Ground Maintenance for Department of Military Affairs

Article I - Prohibitions

1.1 Representation Regarding Gratuities and Kickbacks

The bidder, offeror, or contractor represents that it has not violated, is not violating, and promises that it will not violate the prohibition against gratuities and kickbacks set forth in §11206 (Gratuities and Kickbacks) of the Guam Procurement Regulations.”

1.2 Representation Regarding Contingent Fees

The contractor represents that it has not retained a person to solicit or secure a territorial contract upon an agreement or understanding for a commission, percentage, brokerage, or contingent fee, except for retention of bona fide employees or bona fide established commercial selling agencies for the purpose of securing business.

1.3 Representation Regarding Ethical Standards for Government Employees and Former Government Employees

The bidder, offeror, or contractor represents that it has not knowingly influenced and promises that it will not knowingly influence a government employee to breach any of the ethical standards set forth in 5 GCA Chapter 5 Article 11 (Ethics in Public Contracting) of the Guam Procurement Act and in Chapter 11 of the Guam Procurement Regulations.

1.4 Restriction Against Contractors Employing Convicted Sex Offenders From Working at Government of Guam Venues

- (1) no person providing services on behalf of the contractor has been convicted of a sex offense under the provisions of Chapter 25 of Title 9 GCA or an offense as defined in Article 2 of Chapter 28, Title 9 GCA, or an offense in another jurisdiction with, at a minimum, the same elements as such offenses, or who is listed on the Sex Offender Registry; and
- (2) if any person providing services on behalf of the contractor is convicted of a sex offense under the provisions of Chapter 25 of Title 9 GCA or an offense as defined in Article 2 of Chapter 28, Title 9 GCA or an offense in another jurisdiction with, at a minimum, the same elements as such offenses, or who is listed on the Sex Offender Registry, that such person will be immediately removed from working at said agency and that the administrator of said agency be informed of such within twenty-four (24) hours of such conviction.

Article II – Debarment and Suspension

2.1 Debarment and Suspension. Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) 2 CFR Part 200 §200.214

(Executive Orders 12549 and 12689)—A contract award (see 2 CFR 180.220) must not be made to parties listed on the government wide exclusions in the System for Award Management (SAM), in accordance with the OMB guidelines at 2 CFR 180 that implement Executive Orders 12549 (3 CFR part 1986 Comp., p. 189) and 12689 (3 CFR part 1989 Comp., p. 235), “Debarment and Suspension.” SAM Exclusions contains the names of parties debarred, suspended, or otherwise excluded by agencies, as well as parties declared ineligible under statutory or regulatory authority other than Executive Order 12549. The Awardee certifies that neither it nor its principals are presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from participation in this transaction by any federal, state, or local government. If, at any time during the term of this contract, the Contractor becomes debarred or suspended, the Contractor shall immediately notify GSA in writing.

Article III – Contract Terms and Non-Performance

3.1 Required Delivery Date.

The Awardee shall provide the goods/services within seven (7) days of receipt of purchase order.

3.2 Term of Contract.

The Awardee shall provide the goods and/or services for a period of one (1) year (the “initial term”).

3.3 Curing Period for Non-Performance:

Awardee shall cure any and all defects noted by DMA within five (5) calendar days after receipt of notice by DMA.

Article IV – Insurance and Liability

4.1 Insurance Requirement.

The Awardee shall, at its sole expense, maintain and provide evidence of Commercial General Liability (CGL) insurance written on an occurrence basis for the entire duration of the contract. Such coverage shall include limits of not less than \$1,000,000.00 per occurrence and \$2,000,000.00 in the annual aggregate for bodily injury, personal injury, and property damage. The Awardee must submit a valid Certificate of Insurance (COI) upon receipt of purchase or to Department of Military Affairs to demonstrate compliance; failure to maintain continuous coverage or provide proof of renewal during the term of the agreement shall constitute a material breach of contract.

4.2 Indemnify Government of Guam.

The awardee shall be responsible for any and all damage(s) and/or liability while performing the work and hold DMA and the Government of Guam harmless and free from any and all liability and claims.

Article V – Payment, Billing Information, and Inquiries

5.1 Payment.

Invoices for payment of services rendered shall be submitted no later than five (5) calendar day at the end of the preceding month and shall be accompanied by monthly report for all services completed and rendered.

5.2 Billing Information and All Inquiries.

**GOVERNMENT OF GUAM
GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS**

SEALED BID SOLICITATION AND AWARD

Only those Boxes checked below with an “X” are applicable to this bid.

1. **[X] AUTHORITY:** This solicitation is issued subject to all the provision of the Guam Procurement Act (5GCA, Chapter 5) and the Guam Procurement Regulations (copies of both are available at the Office of the Complier of laws, Department of Law, copies available for inspection at General Services Agency). It requires all parties involved in the Preparation, negotiation, performance, or administration of contracts to act in good faith.
2. **[X] GENERAL INTENTION:** Unless otherwise specified, it is the declared and acknowledged intention and meaning of these General Terms and conditions for the bidder to provide the Government of Guam (Government) with specified services or with materials, supplies or equipment completely assembled and ready for use.
3. **[X] TAXES:** Bidders are cautioned that they are subject to Guam Income Taxes as well as all other taxes on Guam Transactions. Specific information on taxes may be obtained from the Director of Revenue and Taxation.
4. **[X] LICENSING:** Bidders are cautioned that the Government will not consider for award any offer submitted by a bidder who has not complied with the Guam Licensing Law. Specific information on licenses may be obtained from the Director of Revenue and Taxation.
5. **[X] LOCAL PROCUREMENT PREFERENCE:** All procurement of supplies and services where possible, will be made from among businesses licensed to do business on Guam in accordance with 5 GCA, Chapter 5 §5008.
6. **[X] COMPLIANCE WITH SPECIFICATIONS AND OTHER SOLICITATION REQUIREMENTS:** Bidders shall comply with all specifications and other requirements of the Solicitation.
7. **[] “ALL OR NONE” BIDS:** By checking this item, the Government is requesting all of the bid items/requirements to be bid on or none at all in accordance with 2 GAR, Division 4, Section 3115(f).
8. **[X] INDEPENDENT PRICE DETERMINATION:** The bidder, upon signing the Invitation for Bid, certifies that the prices in his bid were derived at without collusion, and acknowledge that collusion and anti-competitive practices are prohibited by law. Violations will be subject to the provision of Section 5651 of that of the Guam Procurement Act. Other existing civil, criminal or administrative remedies are not impaired and may be in addition to the remedies in Section 5651 of the Government code.
9. **[X] BIDDER’S PRICE:** The Government will consider not more than two (2) (Basic and Alternate) item prices and the bidder shall explain fully each price if supplies, materials, equipment, and/or specified services offered comply with specifications and the products origin. Where basic or alternate bid meets the minimum required specification, cost and other factors will be considered. Failure to explain this requirement will result in rejection of the bid.
10. **[X] BID ENVELOPE:** Envelope shall be sealed and marked with the bidder’s name, Bid number, time, date and place of Bid Opening.
11. **[X] BID GUARANTEE REQUIREMENT:** Bidder is required to submit a Bid Guarantee in the form of a Surety Bond (Bid Bond) or Certified Cashier’s Check in the same bid envelope to be held by the Government pending award. The Bid Bond or Certified Cashier’s Check must be issued by any local surety or banking institution licensed to do business on Guam and made payable to the Treasurer of Guam or the General Services Agency in the amount of fifteen percent (15%) of his highest total bid offer. The Bid Bond must be submitted on Government Standard Form BB-1 (copy enclosed). Personal Checks will not be accepted as Bid Guarantee. If a successful Bidder (contractor) withdraws from the bid or fails to enter into contract within the prescribed time, such Bid Guarantee will be forfeited to the Government of Guam. Bids will be disqualified if not accompanied by Bid Bond or Certified Cashier’s check. Bidder must include in his/her bid a valid Certificate of Authority from the Government of Guam to show proof that the Surety Company named on the bond instrument is authorized by the Government of Guam and qualified to do business on Guam. In addition, when the Surety is a foreign or alien corporation, a valid Power of Attorney executed by two (2) authorized officers of the Surety and issued to the Resident General Agent shall be required. For detailed information on bonding matters, contact the Department of Revenue and Taxation. Failure to submit the required Certificate of Authority, and where applicable, the Power of Attorney, shall be cause for rejection of bid. **Pursuant to 5 GCA § 5212, all competitive sealed bidding for the procurement of supplies or services exceeding \$25,000.00 a 15% Bid Security of the total bid price must accompany the bid package. The Bid Bond or Certified Cashier’s Check will serve as Bid Security for this procurement.**

12. **[X] PERFORMANCE GUARANTEE:** Bidders who are awarded a contract under this solicitation, guarantee that goods will be delivered or required services performed within the time specified. Failure to perform the contract in a satisfactory manner may be cause for suspension or debarment from doing business with the Government of Guam. In addition, the Government will hold the Vendor liable and will enforce the requirements as set forth in Section 41 of these General Terms and Conditions.
13. **[X] SURETY BONDS:** Bid and Bid Bonds coverage must be signed or countersigned in Guam by a foreign or alien surety's resident general agent. The surety must be an Insurance Company, authorized by the government of Guam and qualified to do business in Guam. Bids will be disqualified if the Surety Company does not have a valid Certificate of Authority from the Government of Guam to conduct business in Guam.
14. **[X] COMPETENCY OF BIDDERS:** Bids will be considered only from the bidders who, in the opinion of the Government, can show evidence of their ability, experience, equipment, and facilities to render satisfactory service.
15. **[X] DETERMINATION OF RESPONSIBILITY OF BIDDERS:** The Chief Procurement Officer reserves the right for securing from bidders information to determine whether or not they are responsible and to inspect plant site, place of business; and supplies and services as necessary to determine their responsibility in accordance with Section 16 of these General Terms and Conditions. (2 GAR, Div. 4 § 3116)
16. **[X] STANDARD FOR DETERMINATION OF LOWEST RESPONSIBLE BIDDER:** In determining the lowest responsible offer, the Chief Procurement Officer shall be guided by the following:
 - a) Price of items offered.
 - b) The ability, capacity, and skill of the Bidder to perform.
 - c) Whether the Bidder can perform promptly or within the specified time.
 - d) The quality of performance of the Bidder with regards to awards previously made to him.
 - e) The previous and existing compliance by the Bidder with laws and regulations relative to procurement.
 - f) The sufficiency of the financial resources and ability of the Bidder to perform.
 - g) The ability of the bidder to provide future maintenance and services for the subject of the award.
 - h) The compliance with all of the conditions to the Solicitation.
17. **[X] TIE BIDS:** If the bids are for the same unit price or total amount in the whole or in part, the Chief Procurement Officer will determine award based on 2 GAR, Div. 4, § 3109(o) (2) or to reject all such bids.
18. **[] BRAND NAMES:** Any reference in the Solicitation to manufacturer's Brand Names and number is due to lack of a satisfactory specification of commodity description. Such preference is intended to be descriptive, but not restrictive and for the sole purpose of indicating prospective bidders a description of the article or services that will be satisfactory. Bids on comparable items will be considered provided the bidder clearly states in his bid the exact articles he is offering and how it differs from the original specification.
19. **[] DESCRIPTIVE LITERATURE:** Descriptive literature(s) as specified in this solicitation must be furnished as a part of the bid and must be received at the date and time set for opening Bids. The literature furnished must clearly identify the item(s) in the Bid. The descriptive literature is required to establish, for the purpose of evaluation and award, details of the product(s) the bidder proposes to furnish including design, materials, components, performance characteristics, methods of manufacture, construction, assembly or other characteristics which are considered appropriate. Rejection of the Bid will be required if the descriptive literature(s) do not show that the product(s) offered conform(s) to the specifications and other requirements of this solicitation. Failure to furnish the descriptive literature(s) by the time specified in the Solicitation will require rejection of the bid.
20. **[] SAMPLES:** Sample(s) of item(s) as specified in this solicitation must be furnished as a part of the bid and must be received at the date and time set for opening Bids. The sample(s) should represent exactly what the bidder proposes to furnish and will be used to determine if the item(s) offered complies with the specifications. Rejection of the Bid will be required if the sample(s) do not show that the product(s) offered conform(s) to the specifications and other requirements of this solicitation. Failure to furnish the sample(s) by the time specified in the Solicitation will require rejection of the Bid.
21. **[] LABORATORY TEST:** Successful bidder is required to accompany delivery of his goods with a Laboratory Test Report indicating that the product he is furnishing the Government meets with the specifications. This report is on the bidder's account and must be from a certified Testing Association.
22. **[X] AWARD, CANCELLATION, & REJECTION:** Award shall be made to the lowest responsible and responsive bidder, whose bid is determined to be the most advantageous to the Government, taking into consideration the evaluation factors set forth in this solicitation. No other factors or criteria shall be used in the evaluation. The right is reserved as the interest of the Government may require to waive any minor irregularity in bid received. The Chief Procurement Officer shall have the authority to award,

cancel, or reject bids, in whole or in part for any one or more items if he determines it is in the public interest. Award issued to the lowest responsible bidder within the specified time for acceptance as indicated in the solicitation, results in a bidding contract without further action by either party. In case of an error in the extension of prices, unit price will govern. It is the policy of the Government to award contracts to qualified local bidders. The Government reserves the right to increase or decrease the quantity of the items for award and make additional awards for the same type items and the vendor agrees to such modifications and additional awards based on the bid prices for a period of thirty (30) days after original award. No award shall be made under this solicitation which shall require advance payment or irrevocable letter of credit from the government (2 GAR, Div.4 §1103).

23. **MARKING:** Each outside container shall be marked with the Purchase Order number, item number, brief item description and quantity. Letter marking shall not be less than 3/4" in height.
24. **SCHEDULE FOR DELIVERY:** Successful bidder shall notify the General Services Agency, Telephone No. (671) 475-1710, at least twenty-four (24) hours before delivery of any item under this solicitation.
25. **BILL OF SALE:** Successful supplier shall render Bills of Sale for each item delivered under this contract. Failure to comply with this requirement will result in rejection of delivery. The Bill of Sale must accompany the items delivered but will not be considered as an invoice for payment. Supplier shall bill the Government in accordance with billing instructions as indicated on the Purchase Order.
26. **MANUFACTURER'S CERTIFICATE:** Successful bidder is required, upon delivery of any item under this contract, to furnish a certificate from the manufacturer indication that the goods meet the specifications. Failure to comply with this request will result in rejection of delivery payment. Supplier shall bill the Government in accordance with billing instructions as indicated on the Purchase Order.
27. **INSPECTION:** All supplies, materials, equipment, or services delivered under this contract shall be subject to the inspection and/or test conducted by the Government at destination. If in any case the supplies, materials, equipment, or services are found to be defective in material, workmanship, performance, or otherwise do not conform with the specifications, the Government shall have the right to reject the items or require that they be corrected. The number of days required for correction will be determined by the Government.
28. **MOTOR VEHICLE SAFETY REQUIREMENTS:** The Government will only consider Bids on motor vehicles which comply with the requirements of the National Traffic and Motor Vehicle safety Act of 1966 (Public Law 89-563) and Clean Air Act as amended (Public Law 88-206), that are applicable to Guam. Bidders shall state if the equipment offered comply with these aforementioned Federal Laws.
29. **SAFETY INSPECTION:** All motor vehicles delivered under this contract must pass the Government of Guam Vehicle Inspection before delivery at destination.
30. **GUARANTEE:**
- a. **Guarantee of Vehicle Type of Equipment:**
The successful bidder shall guarantee vehicular type of equipment offered against defective parts, workmanship, and performance, for a period of not less than one (1) year after date of receipt of equipment. Bidder shall also provide service to the equipment for at least one (1) year. Service to be provided shall include, but will not be limited to tune ups (change of spark plugs, contact points and condensers) and lubrication (change of engine and transmission oil). All parts and labor shall be at the expense of the bidder. All parts found defective and not caused by misuse, negligence or accident within the guarantee period shall be repaired, replaced, or adjusted within six (6) working days after notice from the Government and without cost to the Government. Vehicular type of equipment as used in this context shall include equipment used for transportation as differentiated from tractors, backhoes, etc.
 - b. **Guarantee of Other Type of Equipment:** The successful bidder shall guarantee all other types of equipment offered, except those mentioned in 30a, above, against defective parts, workmanship, and performance for a period of not less than three (3) months after date of receipt of equipment. Bidder shall also provide service to the equipment for at least three (3) months. All parts found defective within that period shall be repaired or replaced by the Contractor without cost to the Government. Repairs, adjustments or replacements of defective parts shall be completed by the contractor within six (6) working days after notice from the Government.
 - c. **Compliance with this Section is a condition of this Bid.**
31. **REPRESENTATION REGARDING ETHICS IN PUBLIC PROCUREMENT:** The bidder or contractor represents that it has not knowingly influenced and promises that it will not knowingly influence a Government employee to breach any of the ethical standards and represents that it has not violated, is not violating, and promises that it will not violate the prohibition against gratuities and kickbacks set forth on Chapter 11 (Ethics in Public Contracting) of the Guam Procurement Act and in Chapter 11 of the Guam Procurement Regulations.

- 32. [X] REPRESENTATION REGARDING CONTINGENT FEES:** The contractor represents that it has not retained a person to solicit or secure a Government contract upon an agreement or understanding for a commission, percentage, brokerage, or contingent fee, except for retention of bona fide employees or bona fide established commercial selling agencies for the purpose of securing business (GPR Section 11-207).
- 33. [X] EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY:** Contractors shall not discriminate against any employee or applicant of employment because of race, color, religion, sex, or national origin. The contractor will take affirmative action to ensure that employees are treated equally during employment without regards to their race, color, religion, sex, or national origin.
- 34. [X] COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS:** Bidders awarded a contract under this Solicitation shall comply with the applicable standard, provisions, and stipulations of all pertinent Federal and/or local laws, rules, and regulations relative to the performance of this contract and the furnishing of goods.
- 35. [X] CHANGES CLAUSE:** 2 GAR, Div. 4 §6101 (3).
- (1) Change Order. By a written order, at any time, and without notice to surety, the Chief Procurement Officer or the head of a Purchasing Agency may, subject to all appropriate adjustments, make changes within the general scope of this contract in any one or more of the following:
- (A) Drawings, designs, or specifications, if the supplies to be furnished are to be specially manufactured for the territory in accordance therewith;
 - (B) method of shipment or packing; or
 - (C) place of delivery.
- (2) Adjustments of Price or Time for Performance. If any such change order increases or decreases the contractor's cost of, or the time required for performance of any part of the work under this contract, whether or not changed by the order, an adjustment shall be made and the contract modified in writing accordingly. Any adjustment in contract price made pursuant to this clause shall be determined in accordance with the Price Adjustment Clause of this contract.
- Failure of the parties to agree to an adjustment shall not excuse the contractor from proceeding with the contract as changed, provided that the territory promptly and duly make such provisional adjustments in payment or time for performance as may be reasonable. By proceeding with the work, the contractor shall not be deemed to have prejudiced any claim for additional compensation, or an extension of time for completion.
- (3) Time Period for Claim. Within 30 days after receipt of a written change order under Paragraph (1) (Change Order) of this clause, unless such period is extended by the Procurement Officer in writing, the contractor shall file notice of intent to assert a claim for an adjustment. Later notification shall not bar the contractor's claim unless the territory is prejudiced by the delay in notification.
- (4) Claims Barred After Final Payment. No claim by the contractor for an adjustment hereunder shall be allowed if notice is not given prior to final payment under this contract.
- (5) Other Claims not Barred. In the absence of such a change order, nothing in this clause shall be deemed to restrict the contractor's right to pursue a claim arising under the contract if pursued in accordance with the clause entitled, "Claims Based on a Procurement Officer's Actions or Omissions, Notice of Claim Clause", or for breach of contract."
- 36. [X] STOP WORK ORDER:** 2 GAR, Div. 4 §6101 (4).
- (I) Order to Stop Work. The Procurement Officer may, by written order to the contractor, at any time, and without notice to any surety, require the contractor to stop all or any part of the work called for by this contract. This order shall be for a specified period not exceeding 90 days after the order is delivered to the contractor, unless the parties agree to any further period. Any such order shall be identified specifically as a stop work order issued pursuant to this clause. Upon receipt of such an order, the contractor shall forthwith comply with its terms and take all reasonable steps to minimize the occurrence of costs allocable to the work covered by the order during the period of work stoppage. Before the stop work order expires, or within any further period to which the parties shall have agreed, the Procurement Officer shall either:
- (i) cancel the stop work order; or
 - (ii) terminate the work covered by such order as provided in the "Termination for Default Clause" or the "Termination for Convenience Clause" of this contract.

37. **[X] CANCELLATION OF INVITATION FOR BIDS OR REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS:** Any Invitation for Bid may be cancelled, or any or all bids or proposals may be rejected in whole or in part as may be specified in the solicitation, when it is in the best interests of the Territory in accordance with regulations promulgated by the Policy Office. The reasons therefor shall be made part of the contract file.
38. **[X] TIME FOR COMPLETION:** It is hereby understood and mutually agreed by and between the contractor and the Government that the time for delivery to final destination or the timely performance of certain services is an essential condition of this contract. If the contractor refuses or fails to perform any of the provisions of this contract within the time specified in the Purchase Order (from the date Purchase Order is acknowledged by vendor), then the contractor is in default. Defaults will be treated subject to and in accordance with the provisions of 2 GAR, Div. 4 § 6101(8)
39. **[X] JUSTIFICATION OF DELAY:** Bidders who are awarded contracts under this Solicitation, guarantee that the goods will be delivered to their destination or required services rendered within the time specified. If the bidder is not able to meet the specified delivery date, he is required to notify the Chief Procurement Officer of such delay. Notification shall be in writing and shall be received by the Chief Procurement Officer at least twenty-four (24) hours before the specified delivery date. Notification of delay shall include an explanation of the causes and reasons for the delay including statement(s) from supplier or shipping company causing the delay. The Government reserves the right to reject delay justification if, in the opinion of the Chief Procurement Officer, such justification is not adequate.
40. **[X] SERVICE-DISABLED VETERAN OWNED BUSINESS PREFERENCE:** Bidding is subject to the policy in favor of Service-Disabled Veteran Owned Business as defined in 5 GCA sections 5011 and 5012.
41. **[X] LIQUIDATED DAMAGES:** When the contractor is given notice of delay or nonperformance as specified in Paragraph 1 (Default) of the Termination for Default Clause of this contract and fails to cure in the time specified, the contractor shall be liable for damages for delay in the amount of one-fourth of one percent (1%) of outstanding order per calendar day from date set for cure until either the territory reasonable obtains similar supplies or services if the contractor is terminated for default, or until the contractor provides the supplies or services if the contractor is not terminated for default. To the extent that the contractor's delay or non-performance is excused under Paragraph 15 (Excuse for Nonperformance or Delayed Performance) of the Termination for Default Clause of this contract, liquidated damages shall not be due the territory. The contractor remains liable for damages caused other than by delay. **2 GAR, Div. 4 §6101(d).**
42. **[X] PHYSICAL LIABILITY:** If it becomes necessary for the Vendor, either as principal, agent or employee, to enter upon the premises or property of the Government of Guam in order to construct, erect, inspect, make delivery or remove property hereunder, the Vendor hereby covenants and agrees to take, use, provide and make all proper, necessary and sufficient precautions, safeguards and protections against the occurrence of any accidents, injuries or damages to any person or property during the progress of the work herein covered, and to be responsible for, and to indemnify and save harmless the Government of Guam from the payment of all sums of money by reason of all or any such accidents, injuries or damages that may occur upon or about such work, and fines, penalties and loss incurred for or by reasons of the violations of any territorial ordinance, regulations, or the laws of Guam or the United States, while the work is in progress. Contractor will carry insurance to indemnify the Government of Guam against any claim for loss, damage or injury to property or persons arising out of the performance of the Contractor or his employees and agents of the services covered by the contract and the use, misuse or failure of any equipment used by the contractor or his employees or agents, and shall provide certificates of such insurance to the Government of Guam when required.
43. **[X] Contract will be cancelled if funds not appropriated or insufficient, and that government will timely inform contractor.** 2 GAR, Div.4 §3121(e) (1) (C) and 2 GAR, Div.4 § 3121(e)(1)(D).
44. **[] If cancelled, contractor will be reimbursed unamortized reasonably incurred non-recurring costs.** 2 GAR, Div.4 §3121(e)(1)(G).
45. **[X] Debarment and Suspension:** (Executive Orders 12549 and 12689)—A contract award (see 2 CFR 180.220) must not be made to parties listed on the government wide exclusions in the System for Award Management (SAM), in accordance with the OMB guidelines at 2 CFR 180 that implement Executive Orders 12549 (3 CFR part 1986 Comp., p. 189) and 12689 (3 CFR part 1989 Comp., p. 235), "Debarment and Suspension." SAM Exclusions contains the names of parties debarred, suspended, or otherwise excluded by agencies, as well as parties declared ineligible under statutory or regulatory authority other than Executive Order 12549.
46. **[X] Byrd Anti-Lobbying Amendment:** (31 U.S.C. 1352)—Contractors that apply or bid for an award exceeding \$100,000 must file the required certification. Each tier certifies to the tier above that it will not and has not used Federal appropriated funds to pay any person or organization for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a member of Congress, officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a member of Congress in connection with obtaining any Federal contract, grant or any other award covered by 31 U.S.C. 1352. Each tier must also disclose any lobbying with non-Federal funds that takes place in connection with obtaining any Federal award. Such disclosures are forwarded from tier to tier up to the non-Federal award.

1. **BID FORMS:** Each bidder shall be provided with one (1) Solicitation form. Additional copies may be provided upon request. Bidders requesting additional copies of said forms will be charged per page in accordance with 5 GCA § 10203 of the Government Code of Guam. All payments for this purpose shall be by cash, certified check or money order and shall be made payable to the General Services Agency (EO 86-24).
2. **PREPARATIONS OF BIDS:**
 - a) Bidders are required to examine the drawings, specifications, schedule, and all instructions. Failure to do so will be at bidder's risk.
 - b) Each bidder shall furnish the information required by the Solicitation. The bidder shall sign the solicitation and print or type his name on the IFB Form. Erasures or other changes must be initialed by the person signing the bid. Bids signed by an agent are to be accompanied by evidence of this authority unless such evidence has been previously furnished to the issuing office.
 - c) Unit price for each unit offered shall be shown and such price shall include packing unless otherwise specified. A total shall be entered in the amount column of the Bid Form for each item offered. In case of discrepancies between a unit price and extended price, the unit price will be presumed to be correct. **Unit price(s) and extended price(s) apart from the "Basic and Alternate" bid, furnished outside of the space(s) provided will not be considered.**
 - d) Bids for supplies or services other than those specified will not be considered. Time, if stated as a number of days, means calendar days and will include Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays beginning the day after the issuance of a Fully Executed Purchase Order. Time stated ending on a Saturday, Sunday or Government of Guam legal holiday will end at the close of the next business day.
 - e) **No Entitlement to Preparation Costs – the bidder expressly waives any right it may have against the government for any expenses incurred in connection with the preparation of its bid.**
 - f) **Bidder must clearly indicate compliance in the "Bidding On/Remarks" column for all listed specifications or requirements. Failure to indicate compliance shall render the bid non-responsive and is subject to rejection.**
3. **EXPLANATION TO BIDDERS:** Any explanation desired by a bidder regarding the meaning or interpretation of the Solicitation, drawings, specifications, etc., must be submitted in writing and with sufficient time allowed for a written reply to reach all bidders before the submission of their bids. Oral explanations or instructions given before the award of the contract will not be binding. Any information given to a prospective bidder concerning a Solicitation will be furnished to all prospective bidders in writing as an amendment to the Solicitation if such information would be prejudicial to informed bidders.
4. **PRE-OPENING MODIFICATION OR WITHDRAWAL OF BIDS:** Bids may be modified or withdrawn by written notice received in the office designated in the Invitation for Bids prior to the time and date set for bid opening. 2 GAR §3109(j)(1).
5. **ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF AMENDMENTS TO SOLICITATIONS:** Receipt of an amendment to a Solicitation by a bidder must be acknowledged by signing an acknowledgement of receipt of the amendment. Such acknowledgement must be received prior to the hour and date specified for receipt of bids.
6. **SUBMISSION OF BIDS:**
 - a) **Bids and modifications thereof must be submitted in duplicate – one (1) original and one (1) copy – and shall be enclosed in sealed envelopes and addressed to the office specified in the Solicitation.** The bidder shall show the hour and date specified in the Solicitation for receipt, the IFB number, and the name and address of the bidder on the face of the envelope. **Failure to submit in duplicate will result in the rejection of bids.**
 - b) Telegraphic and electronic bids will not be considered unless authorized by the Solicitation. However, bids may be modified or withdrawn by written or telegraphic notice, provided such notice is received prior to the hour and date specified for receipt (see paragraph 6 of these instructions).
 - c) Samples of items, when required, must be submitted within the time specified, unless otherwise specified by the Government, at no expense to the Government. If not destroyed by testing, samples will be returned at bidder's request and expense, unless otherwise specified by the Solicitation.

d) Samples or descriptive literature should not be submitted unless it is required on this solicitation. Regardless of any Attempt by a bidder to condition the bid, unsolicited samples or descriptive literature will not be examined or tested at the bidder's risk, and will not be deemed to vary any of the provisions of this Solicitation.

7. **FAILURE TO SUBMIT BID:** If no bid is to be submitted, do not return the IFB packet unless otherwise specified. A letter may be sent to the issuing office advising whether future solicitations for the type of supplies or services covered by this IFB are desired.

8. **LATE BID, LATE WITHDRAWALS, AND LATE MODIFICATIONS:**

a) Definition: Any bid received after the time and date set for receipt of bids is late. Any withdrawal or modification of a bid received after the time and date set for opening of bids at the place designated for opening is late (Guam Procurement Regulations 2 GAR, Div.4 §3109(k)).

b) Treatment: No late bid, late modification, or late withdrawal will be considered unless received before contract award, and the bid, modification, or withdrawal would have been timely but for the action or inaction of territorial personnel directly serving the procurement activity.

9. **CANCELLATION OR REVISION OF BID:** This IFB may be canceled, or any and all bids may be rejected in whole or in part as may be pursuant to 2 GAR §3115, when it is in the best interest of the Government. Additionally, in accordance with 2 GAR §9105, if prior to award it is determined that a solicitation or proposed award of a contract is in violation of the law, then the solicitation or proposed award shall be canceled or revised to comply with the law. The reasons therefore shall be made part of the contract file.

10. **REJECTION OF BIDS:** Any bidder submitted in response to this IFB may be rejected in whole or in part with it is in the best interest of the Government, in accordance with 2 GAR, Division 4, Chapter 3 §3115(e). Reasons for rejecting bids include but are not limited to: (1) The business that submitted the bids is non-responsive as determined under 2 GAR, Division 4, Chapter 3 §3116; (2) The bid ultimately fails to meet the announced requirements of the Government in some material respect; or (3) The bid price is clearly unreasonable. Upon request, unsuccessful bidders shall be advised of the reasons for rejection.

When bids are rejected, or a solicitation canceled after bids are received, the bids which have been opened shall be retained in the procurement file, or if unopened, returned to the bidders upon request, or otherwise disposed of pursuant to 2 GAR, Division 4, Chapter 3 §3115(g).

11. **TERMINATION OF CONTRACT:**

a) Termination for Cause/Default: If the Contractor refuses or fails to perform any of the provisions of this Contract with such diligence as will ensure its completion within the time specified in this Contract, or any extension thereof, otherwise fails to timely satisfy the Contract provisions, or commits any other substantial breach of this Contract, the government may notify the Contractor in writing of the delay or non-performance and if not cured in ten (10) days or any longer time specified in writing by the Procurement Officer, such officer may terminate the Contractor's right to proceed with the Contract or such part of the Contract as to which there has been delay or a failure to properly perform. In the event of termination in whole or in part the government may procure similar supplies or services in a manner and upon terms deemed appropriate by the government. The Contractor shall continue performance of the Contract to the extent it is not terminated and shall be liable for excess costs incurred in procuring similar goods or services.

b) Termination for Convenience: The government, when the interests of the territory so required, terminate this Contract in whole or in part, for the convenience of the territory. The government shall give written notice of the termination to the Contractor specifying the part of the Contract terminated and when termination becomes effective. The Contractor shall incur no further obligations in connection with the terminated work and on the date set in the notice of termination the Contract will stop work to the extent specified. The Contractor shall also terminate outstanding orders and subcontracts as they relate to the terminated work. The Contractor shall settle the liabilities and claims arising out of the termination of subcontracts and orders connected with the terminated work. The government may direct the Contractor to assign the Contractor's right, title, and interest under terminated orders or subcontracts to the territory. The Contractor must still complete the work not terminated by the notice of termination and may incur obligations as necessary to do so.

The Contractor shall submit a termination claim specifying the amounts due because of the Termination for Convenience together with cost or pricing data to the extent required by 2 GAR, Division 4, Chapter 3 §3118. If the Contractor fails to file a termination claim within one year from the effective date of termination, the government may pay the Contractor, if at all, an amount set in accordance with this section. The government and the Contractor may agree to a settlement provided the Contractor has filed a termination claim as required herein and the settlement does not exceed the total contract price plus settlement costs reduced by payments previously made by the territory and the contract price of the work not terminated. Absent agreement of a settlement, the government shall pay the Contractor the following amounts: with respect to all contract

work performed prior to the effective date of the termination, the total, without duplication of any items, of: (a) the cost of such work plus a fair and reasonable profit on such portion of the work (such profit shall not include anticipatory profit or consequential damages) less amount paid or to be paid for completed portions of such work; provided that if it appears that the Contractor would have sustained a loss if the entire contract would have been completed, no profit shall be allowed or included and the amount of compensation shall be reduced to reflect the anticipated rate of loss; (b) cost of settling and paying claims arising out of the termination of subcontracts or orders pursuant to this clause. These costs must not include costs paid in accordance with subsection (a) above; (c) the reasonable settlement costs of the Contractor including accounting, legal, clerical, and other expenses reasonably necessary for the preparation of settlement claims and supporting data with respect to the terminated portion of the contract and for the termination and settlement of subcontracts thereunder. The total sum to be paid the Contractor under this subsection shall not exceed the total contract price plus the reasonable settlement costs of the Contractor reduced by the number of payments otherwise made, the proceeds of any sales of supplies or materials under this section, and the contract price of work not terminated.

- c) Condition of Termination: Notwithstanding the foregoing, the cessation of services for people requiring services shall be contingent upon the Government obtaining a substitute provider for the services and the contractor shall cooperate by taking all reasonable and necessary steps to ensure that services are not interrupted and transferred to the succeeding provider. The contractor shall issue a written memorandum detailing the status of the contractor's ongoing services initiating termination or any fault of either party.

12. MANDATORY DISPUTES RESOLUTION CLAUSE: In the event of a conflict between this "Mandatory Disputes Resolution Clause" and any other terms in this contract, it is the intent of the government of Guam and the contractor that the terms of this clause are to be given precedence.

(1) Disputes – Contractual Controversies. The government of Guam and the contractor agree to attempt resolution of all controversies which arise under, or are by virtue of, this contract through mutual agreement. If the controversy is not resolved by mutual agreement, then the contractor shall request the head of the purchasing agency, or their designee, in writing to issue a final decision within sixty days after receipt of the written request in keeping with 5 GCA, Chapter 5 §5427(c). The head of the purchasing agency or their designee shall immediately furnish a copy of the decision to the contractor, by certified mail with a return receipt requested, or by any other method that provides evidence of receipt.

(2) Absence of a Written Decision within Sixty Days. If the head of the purchasing agency, or their designee does not issue a written decision within sixty days after written request for a final decision, or within such longer period as may be agreed upon by the parties, then the contractor may proceed as though the head of the purchasing agency, or their designee had issued a decision adverse to the contractor.

(3) Appeals to the Office of Public Accountability. The head of the purchasing agency, or their designee's decision shall be final and conclusive, unless fraudulent or unless the contractor appeals the decision administratively to the Public Auditor in accordance with 5 GCA § 5706.

(4) Disputes – Money Owed To or By the Government of Guam. This subsection applies to appeals of the government of Guam's decision on a dispute. For money owed by or to the government of Guam under this contract, the contractor shall appeal the decision in accordance with the "Governments Claims Act", 5 GCA § 6101 et. Seq., by initially filing a claim with the Office of the Attorney General no later than eighteen months after the decision is rendered by the government of Guam or from the date when a decision should have been rendered. For all other claims by or against the government of Guam arising under this contract, the Office of the Public Auditor has jurisdiction over the appeal from the decision of the government of Guam. Appeals to the Office of the Public Auditor must be made within sixty days of government of Guam's decision or from the date the decision should have been made.

(5) Exhaustion of Administrative Remedies. The contractor shall exhaust all administrative remedies before filing an action in the Superior Court of Guam in accordance with applicable laws.

(6) Performance of Contract Pending Final Resolution by the Court. The contractor shall comply with the government of Guam's decision and proceed diligently with performance of this contract pending final resolution by the Superior Court of Guam of any controversy arising under, or by virtue of, this contract, except where the contractor claims a material breach of this contract by the government of Guam. However, if the head of the purchasing agency determines in writing that continuation of services under this contract is essential to the public's health or safety, then the contractor shall proceed diligently with performance of the contract notwithstanding any claim of material breach by the government of Guam.

13. CONTRACT REMEDIES: Remedies pursuant to 2 GAR, Division 4, Chapter 9 §9101. Any dispute arising under or out of this contract is subject to the provisions of Chapter 9 (Legal and Contractual Remedies) of Guam Procurement Regulations (GAR chapter 9).

14. DISCOUNTS:

- a) Notwithstanding the fact that prompt payment discounts may be offered, such offer will not be considered in evaluating bids for award unless otherwise specified in the Solicitation. However, offered discounts will be taken if payment is made within the discount period, even though not considered in the evaluation of bids.
- b) In connection with any discount offered, time will be computed from date of delivery and acceptance of the supplies to the destination as indicated in the purchase order or contract. Payment is deemed to be made for the purpose of earning the discount on the date of mailing of the Government check.

15. GOVERNMENT FURNISHED PROPERTY: No material, labor or facilities will be furnished by the Government unless otherwise provided for in the Solicitation.

16. RECEIPT, OPENING AND RECORDING OF BIDS: Bids and modifications shall be publicly opened in the presence of one or more witnesses, at the time, date, and place designated in the Invitation for Bids. The name of each bidder, the bid price, and such other information as is deemed appropriate by the Procurement Officer, shall be read aloud and recorded, or otherwise made available. The names and addresses of required witnesses shall be recorded at the opening. The opened bids shall be available for public inspection except to the extent the bidder designates trade secrets or other proprietary data to be confidential as set forth in accordance with Section 17, below. Material so designated shall accompany the bid and shall be readily separable from the bid in order to facilitate public inspection of the non-confidential portion of the bid. Prices, makes and models or catalogue numbers of the items offered, deliveries, and terms of payment shall be publicly available at the time of bid opening regardless of any designation to the contrary (Guam Procurement Regulations 2 GAR, Div.4 §3109(k)).

17. CONFIDENTIAL DATA: If a bidder considers any information submitted in its bid to be confidential, the bidder must identify in writing to the Government those portions which it considers confidential, and must request in writing that those portions be kept confidential. Only trade secrets and proprietary data will be considered confidential. If there is a request for confidentiality, the Government will render a decision on the request as soon as practicable after bids are opened. The Government will advise any bidder requesting confidentiality, of the Government's decision in writing. If the Government does not agree with a bidder's request, then the Government will inform the bidder that it may lodge a protest regarding any part of the Government's decision by following the procedure for protests outlined in Chapter 9 of the Guam Procurement Regulations.

18. PROHIBITION AGAINST GRATUITIES AND KICKBACKS: With respect to this procurement and any other contract that bidder may have or wish to enter into with the Government, the bidder represents that he/she has not violated, is not violating, and promises that he will not violate the prohibition against gratuities and kickbacks set forth in the Guam Procurement Regulations - GAR §11170(e)

19. STATEMENT OF QUALIFICATIONS: The ability capacity and skill of the Bidders to perform; whether the bidder can perform promptly or within the specified time; The quality of performance of the Bidder with regards to awards previously made to him; The sufficiency of the financial resources and ability of the bidders to perform; And the compliance with all of the conditions to the solicitation.

20. WAGE AND BENEFIT COMPLIANCE-CONTRACTORS PROVIDING SERVICES:

- a) Contractor with regard to all person its employs whose purpose in whole or in part is the direct delivery of services contracted for with the Government of Guam in this procurement, shall pay such employees in accordance with the Wage Determination for Guam and the Northern Marianas Islands issued and promulgated by the U.S. Department of Labor for such labor as is employed in the direct deliverance of deliverables to the government of Guam. 5 GCA §5801 Contractor shall be responsible for flowing down this obligation to its subcontractors.
- b) The Wage Determination most recently issued by the U.S. Department of Labor at the time this Agreement was awarded to Contractor shall be used to determine wages and benefits which shall be paid to employees pursuant to this clause. 5 GCA §5801
- c) Should any contract contain a renewal clause, then at the time of renewal adjustments there shall be stipulations contained in that contract for applying the Wage Determination, so that the Wage Determination promulgated by the U.S. Department of Labor on a date most recent to the renewal date shall apply. 5 GCA §5801
- d) In addition to the Wage Determination detailed above, health and similar benefits for employees having a minimum value as detailed in the wage Determination issued and promulgated by the U.S. Department of Labor shall apply. Contractor shall pay a minimum of ten (10) paid holidays per annum per employee. 5 GCA §5802

Any violation of Contractor or its sub-contractor(s) obligations of this section shall be investigated by the Guam Department of Labor and may include a monetary penalty assessment by the Guam Department of Labor of no less than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) per day, and no more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) per day, until such time as a violation has been corrected, as well as the payment of all back wages and benefits due. 5 GCA §5803

- e) In addition to any and all other breach of contract actions the Government of Guam may have under this procurement, in the event there is a violation in the process set forth in subsection (e) above, Contractor may be placed on probationary status by the Chief Procurement Officer of the General Service Agency, or its successor, for a period of one (1) year.
- f) During the probationary status, a Contractor shall not be awarded any contract by any instrumentality of the Government of Guam. A Contractor who has been placed on probationary status, or has been assessed a monetary penalty pursuant to 5 G.C.A. Article 13 Title 5 may appeal such penalty or probationary status to the Superior Court of Guam. 5 GCA §5804
- g) Contractor along with all proposed offerors and submitter under this procurement were required to submit a Declaration of Compliance with Wage Determination laws as part of this procurement with a copy of the most recent Wage Determination for Guam and the Northern Marianas Islands issued and promulgated by the U.S. Department of Labor. 5 GCA §5805
- h) The applicable USDOL Wage Determination Rate Revision (as defined by subsections (b) and (c)) is to this Agreement. Contractor agrees to provide upon written request by the Government of Guam written certification of its compliance with its obligations as part of each invoice, along with the names of any employees, their positions, and detailed wage and benefits paid in keeping with this section. Additionally upon request by Government of Guam the Contractor shall submit source documents as to those individuals provide direct services in part or whole under this Agreement and its payments to them of such wages and benefits.

21. 26. CERTIFICATION OF INDEPENDENT PRICE DETERMINATION: The undersigned Bidder certifies that the bid price submitted was independently arrived at without collusion – GAR §3126

27. Throughout the term of a contract subject to the terms of this Chapter, the contractor shall promptly make any disclosures not made previously and update changes in the identities or other required information, interests, or conflicts of the persons required to be disclosed herein. Failure to comply with this Section shall constitute a material breach of contract. 5 GCA §5233(g).

HEALTH & WELFARE: \$5.55 per hour, up to 40 hours per week, or \$222.00 per week or \$962.00 per month

HEALTH & WELFARE EO 13706: \$5.09 per hour, up to 40 hours per week, or \$203.60 per week, or \$882.27 per month*

*This rate is to be used only when compensating employees for performance on an SCA-covered contract also covered by EO 13706, Establishing Paid Sick Leave for Federal Contractors. A contractor may not receive credit toward its SCA obligations for any paid sick leave provided pursuant to EO 13706.

VACATION: 2 weeks paid vacation after 1 year of service with a contractor or successor; and 4 weeks after 3 years. Length of service includes the whole span of continuous service with the present contractor or successor, wherever employed, and with the predecessor contractors in the performance of similar work at the same Federal facility. (Reg. 29 CFR 4.173)

HOLIDAYS: A minimum of eleven paid holidays per year: New Year's Day, Martin Luther King Jr.'s Birthday, Washington's Birthday, Memorial Day, Juneteenth National Independence Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Columbus Day, Veterans' Day, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day. (A contractor may substitute for any of the named holidays another day off with pay in accordance with a plan communicated to the employees involved.) (See 29 CFR 4.174)

THE OCCUPATIONS WHICH HAVE NUMBERED FOOTNOTES IN PARENTHESES RECEIVE THE FOLLOWING:

1) COMPUTER EMPLOYEES: This wage determination does not apply to any individual employed in a bona fide executive, administrative, or professional capacity, as defined in 29 C.F.R. Part 541. (See 41 C.F.R. 6701(3)). Because most Computer Systems Analysts and Computer Programmers who are paid at least \$27.63 per hour (or at least \$684 per week if paid on a salary or fee basis) likely qualify as exempt computer professionals under 29 U.S.C. 213(a)(1) and 29 U.S.C. 213(a)(17), this wage determination may not include wage rates for all occupations within those job families. In such instances, a conformance will be necessary if there are nonexempt employees in these job families working on the contract.

Job titles vary widely and change quickly in the computer industry, and are not determinative of whether an employee is an exempt computer professional. To be exempt, computer employees who satisfy the compensation requirements must also have a primary duty that consists of:

(1) The application of systems analysis techniques and procedures, including consulting with users, to determine hardware, software or system functional specifications;

(2) The design, development, documentation, analysis, creation, testing or modification of computer systems or programs, including prototypes, based on and related to user or system design specifications;

(3) The design, documentation, testing, creation or modification of computer programs related to machine operating systems; or

(4) A combination of the aforementioned duties, the performance of which requires the same level of skills. (29 C.F.R. 541.400).

Any computer employee who meets the applicable compensation requirements and the above duties test qualifies as an exempt computer professional under both section 13(a)(1) and section 13(a)(17) of the Fair Labor Standards Act. (Field Assistance Bulletin No. 2006-3 (Dec. 14, 2006)). Accordingly, this wage determination will not apply to any exempt computer employee regardless of which of these two exemptions is utilized.

2) AIR TRAFFIC CONTROLLERS AND WEATHER OBSERVERS - NIGHT PAY & SUNDAY PAY: If you work at night as part of a regular tour of duty, you will earn a night differential and receive an additional 10% of basic pay for any hours worked between 6pm and 6am. If you are a full-time employed (40 hours a week) and Sunday is part of your regularly scheduled workweek, you are paid at your rate of basic pay plus a Sunday premium of 25% of your basic rate for each hour of Sunday work which is not overtime (i.e. occasional work on Sunday outside the normal tour of duty is considered overtime work).

**** HAZARDOUS PAY DIFFERENTIAL ****

An 8 percent differential is applicable to employees employed in a position that represents a high degree of hazard when working with or in close proximity to ordnance, explosives, and incendiary materials. This includes work such as screening, blending, dying, mixing, and pressing of sensitive ordnance, explosives, and pyrotechnic compositions such as lead azide, black powder and photoflash powder.

All dry-house activities involving propellants or explosives. Demilitarization, modification, renovation, demolition, and maintenance operations on sensitive ordnance, explosives and incendiary materials. All operations involving re-grading and cleaning of artillery ranges.

A 4 percent differential is applicable to employees employed in a position that represents a low degree of hazard when working with, or in close proximity to ordnance, (or employees possibly adjacent to) explosives and incendiary materials which involves potential injury such as laceration of hands, face, or arms of the employee engaged in the operation, irritation of the skin, minor burns and the like; minimal damage to immediate or adjacent work area or equipment being used. All operations involving, unloading, storage, and hauling of ordnance, explosive, and

incendiary ordnance material other than small arms ammunition. These differentials are only applicable to work that has been specifically designated by the agency for ordnance, explosives, and incendiary material differential pay.

**** UNIFORM ALLOWANCE ****

If employees are required to wear uniforms in the performance of this contract (either by the terms of the Government contract, by the employer, by the state or local law, etc.), the cost of furnishing such uniforms and maintaining (by laundering or dry cleaning) such uniforms is an expense that may not be borne by an employee where such cost reduces the hourly rate below that required by the wage determination. The Department of Labor will accept payment in accordance with the following standards as compliance:

The contractor or subcontractor is required to furnish all employees with an adequate number of uniforms without cost or to reimburse employees for the actual cost of the uniforms. In addition, where uniform cleaning and maintenance is made the responsibility of the employee, all contractors and subcontractors subject to this wage determination shall (in the absence of a bona fide collective bargaining agreement providing for a different amount, or the furnishing of contrary affirmative proof as to the actual cost), reimburse all employees for such cleaning and maintenance at a rate of \$3.35 per week (or \$.67 cents per day). However, in those instances where the uniforms furnished are made of "wash and wear" materials, may be routinely washed and dried with other personal garments, and do not require any special treatment such as dry cleaning, daily washing, or commercial laundering in order to meet the cleanliness or appearance standards set by the terms of the Government contract, by the contractor, by law, or by the nature of the work, there is no requirement that employees be reimbursed for uniform maintenance costs.

**** SERVICE CONTRACT ACT DIRECTORY OF OCCUPATIONS ****

The duties of employees under job titles listed are those described in the "Service Contract Act Directory of Occupations", Fifth Edition (Revision 1), dated September 2015, unless otherwise indicated.

**** REQUEST FOR AUTHORIZATION OF ADDITIONAL CLASSIFICATION AND WAGE RATE, Standard Form 1444 (SF-1444) ****

Conformance Process:

The contracting officer shall require that any class of service employee which is not listed herein and which is to be employed under the contract (i.e., the work to be performed is not performed by any classification listed in the wage determination), be classified by the contractor so as to provide a reasonable relationship (i.e., appropriate level of skill comparison) between such unlisted classifications and the classifications listed in the wage determination (See 29 CFR 4.6(b)(2)(i)). Such conforming procedures shall be initiated by the contractor prior to the performance of contract work by such unlisted class(es) of employees (See 29 CFR 4.6(b)(2)(ii)). The Wage and Hour Division shall make a final determination of conformed classification, wage rate, and/or fringe benefits which shall be paid to all employees performing in the classification from the first day of work on which contract work is performed by them in the classification. Failure to pay such unlisted employees the compensation agreed upon by the interested parties and/or fully determined by the Wage and Hour Division retroactive to the date such class of employees commenced contract work shall be a violation of the Act and this contract. (See 29 CFR 4.6(b)(2)(v)). When multiple wage determinations are included in a contract, a separate SF-1444 should be prepared for each wage determination to which a class(es) is to be conformed.

The process for preparing a conformance request is as follows:

1) When preparing the bid, the contractor identifies the need for a conformed occupation(s) and computes a proposed rate(s).

2) After contract award, the contractor prepares a written report listing in order

the proposed classification title(s), a Federal grade equivalency (FGE) for each proposed classification(s), job description(s), and rationale for proposed wage rate(s), including information regarding the agreement or disagreement of the authorized representative of the employees involved, or where there is no authorized representative, the employees themselves. This report should be submitted to the contracting officer no later than 30 days after such unlisted class(es) of employees performs any contract work.

3) The contracting officer reviews the proposed action and promptly submits a report of the action, together with the agency's recommendations and pertinent information including the position of the contractor and the employees, to the U.S. Department of Labor, Wage and Hour Division, for review (See 29 CFR 4.6(b)(2)(ii)).

4) Within 30 days of receipt, the Wage and Hour Division approves, modifies, or disapproves the action via transmittal to the agency contracting officer, or notifies the contracting officer that additional time will be required to process the request.

5) The contracting officer transmits the Wage and Hour Division's decision to the contractor.

6) Each affected employee shall be furnished by the contractor with a written copy of such determination or it shall be posted as a part of the wage determination (See 29 CFR 4.6(b)(2)(iii)).

Information required by the Regulations must be submitted on SF-1444 or bond paper.

When preparing a conformance request, the "Service Contract Act Directory of Occupations" should be used to compare job definitions to ensure that duties requested are not performed by a classification already listed in the wage determination. Remember, it is not the job title, but the required tasks that determine whether a class is included in an established wage determination. Conformances may not be used to artificially split, combine, or subdivide classifications listed in the wage determination (See 29 CFR 4.152(c)(1))."

Special Provisions

Restriction against Sex Offenders Employed by service providers to
Government of Guam from working on Government Property.

If a contract for services is awarded to the bidder or offeror, then the service provider must warranty that no person in its employment who has been convicted of a sex offense under the provisions of chapter 25 of Title 9 of Guam code Annotated or of an offense defined in Article 2 of chapter 28 of Title 9 of the Guam Code annotated, or who has been convicted in any other jurisdiction of an offense with the same elements as heretofore defined, or who is listed on the Sex Offender Registry, shall provide services on behalf of the service provider while on government of Guam property, with the exception of public highways. If any employee of a service provider is providing services on government property and is convicted subsequent to an award of a contract, then the service provider warrants that it will notify the Government of the conviction within twenty-four (24) hours of the conviction, and will immediately remove such convicted person from providing services on government property. If the service provider is found to be in violation of any of the provisions of this paragraph, then the government will give notice to the service provider to take corrective action. The service provider shall take corrective action within twenty-four (24) hours of notice from the Government, and the service provider shall notify the Government when action has been taken. If the service providers fail to take corrective steps within twenty-four (24) hours of notice from the Government, then the Government in its sole discretion may suspend temporarily and contract for services until corrective action has been taken.

SPECIFICATIONS

Bidder shall provide services necessary to ensure that grounds maintenance is performed at the Barrigada Readiness Complex which include lower Barrigada (Item No. 1), Area behind Bldg. 400 and 700 (Item No. 2) & and 27 Acre Property (Item No. 3) in a manner that will maintain healthy grass, trees, shrubs, and plants and present a clean, neat, and professional appearance and ensure environmental integrity. Grounds maintenance services may require the use of specialized equipment and methods suitable for the condition of the grounds. Grounds Maintenance of these areas are critical for the prevention of overgrowth, managing pests and ensuring that the property remains a hazard free, secured, functional and well-groom extension of the Readiness Complex for the Guam National Guard.

The following services requires the Grounds Maintenance on designated areas which include: roads and driveways, walkways, sidewalks, parking lots, fences, fencelines, lawns, vegetative areas, drains, gutters, etc. Services include Mowing and Brush Cutting, Edging, Trimming, Pruning and/or Removal, Weed Removal, Removal of Debris / Site Sanitation, and Herbicide.

Bidder shall at all times maintain an adequate workforce with supervision for the Uninterrupted performance of all services and to ensure quality control. Bidder shall provide all equipment, specialized equipment, tools, materials, supplies, etc. necessary to comply with the Grounds maintenance specifications.

Frequency of Services to Be Performed:

Bidder shall be required to perform services a minimum of one (1) time per month. All services must be completed.

Scheduling of Services:

Department of Military Affairs will provide a schedule to the bidder of dates to perform services. Regular hours of service shall be between Monday through Friday 8:00am through 4:30pm. Work outside of regular working hours will be subject to prior authorization.

BIDDING ON/REMARKS

Utilities:

Power and water utilities in the facility may be available for the bidders use in the performance of this contract. The bidder shall use best conservation practices when utilizing power and water. The bidder shall operate under conditions that preclude the waste of utilities, which include turning off the water faucets or valves after using the required amount. Use of utilities shall only be used during scheduled service periods and for official purposes only.

Repair / Replacement of Damaged Items and Areas:

The Bidder is responsible for the repair or replacement of all grounds areas and property items—including light posts, fences, and windows—damaged by Bidder personnel or contracted personnel, as well as their vehicles, equipment, tools, or materials during scheduled grounds maintenance. All repairs must match the surrounding environment, and any damaged items must be replaced with those of equal specifications and quality. This responsibility extends to trees and shrubs damaged during trimming; any vegetation that becomes unhealthy due to such damage must be replaced with the same size and type. All repairs and replacements require pre-approval by DMA and must be completed within 15 days of the damage.

Appropriate Signage:

Bidder shall provide appropriate signage to advise and/or caution patrons of cleaning, maintenance, landscaping, etc. activities. All appropriate signage shall be in accordance with all local and federal laws, regulations and/or statutes.

Health and Safety Regulation:

Bidder shall comply with all local and federal Health and Safety regulations to minimize risks and protect employees, visitors and the general public from potential hazards.

Bidder Uniform:

Bidder shall ensure that each respective personnel are wearing at the minimum, uniform shirts with the company name / logo in the front and/or back for easy identification. Bidder personnel shall possess their company badge / identification at all times during scheduled service periods.

Quality Assurance (QA):

The Government shall evaluate the bidder’s performance under this contract in accordance with the Quality Assurance Surveillance Plan (QASP). This plan is primarily focused on what the Government must do to ensure that the bidder has performed in accordance with the performance standards. It defines how the performance standards will be applied, the frequency of surveillance, and acceptable quality level(s).

DESCRIPTION OF SERVICES

Mowing and Brush Cutting:

The Bidder shall be responsible for all mowing and brush cutting activities within the designated grounds maintenance areas to ensure a uniform and professional appearance. During each service visit, grass must be maintained at a consistent height between 1.0 and 4.0 inches. To prevent grass damage and maintain site sanitation, all grass clippings and generated vegetation debris must be collected and removed from the grounds immediately following cutting operations. Bidder shall perform the targeted removal of invasive vegetation and overgrowth in service areas as necessary.

Edging:

The Bidder shall perform professional edging to establish and maintain crisp, well-defined lines between all grass areas and abutting hard or soft surfaces. This work is required to prevent turf encroachment into concrete and asphalt infrastructure, including driveways, walkways, sidewalks, curbs, parking lots, and parking lot bumper blocks. Edging standards also apply to all drains, gutters, fencelines, utility poles, fire hydrants, light posts, and other fixed obstacles, as well as the perimeters of trees, plants, and shrub beds.

Edging services must include the comprehensive removal of all weeds and invasive vegetation from cracks and joints in concrete and asphalt surfaces. All vegetation and organic debris shall be cleared to a minimum depth of 2.0 inches and maintained with a clean 0.5-inch clearance from all adjacent edged surfaces to ensure structural integrity and a uniform, professional appearance across the grounds.

Trimming, Pruning and/or Removal:

The Bidder shall provide comprehensive vegetation management, including the trimming, pruning, and removal of trees, shrubs, and plants on or around all fixed obstacles within the designated service areas. This scope requires that all vegetation surrounding gates, fences, fence lines, utility poles, posts, fire hydrants, parking lot bumper blocks, walkways, sidewalks, boulders, and other permanent structures be maintained at a height consistent with the surrounding mowed turf or removed entirely, as specified by the area’s service requirements. To ensure personnel safety and protect infrastructure integrity, the Bidder is strictly required to notify the Government representative prior to performing any trimming or pruning activities in the immediate vicinity of utility poles or energized power lines.

All shrubs, small trees, and ornamental plants shall be pruned according to professional horticultural standards to maintain their natural growth characteristics and inherent shapes. Pruning practices must focus on enhancing the overall beauty and long-term health of the vegetation by removing dead or diseased wood and promoting vigorous growth. All work shall be executed to prevent mechanical damage to assets while ensuring a neat, professional appearance across the grounds.

Weed Removal:

The Bidder shall be responsible for the systematic removal of all weeds, defined as any undesirable plant growth not intentionally planted or seeded within the service area. This scope specifically includes the eradication of invasive species designated as noxious or prohibited by federal, state, or local agricultural authorities; this includes but is not limited to Chain of Love (Kadena), Mile-a-Minute Vine, Mission Grass, Tangantangan, Siam Weed, Giant Sensitive Plant, and Cogon grass. Additionally, the Bidder must remove all volunteer growth, including seedlings of shrubs, trees, or ornamental grasses germinating in unintended locations such as pavement cracks, walkways, or flower beds, as well as unwanted offshoots such as root-suckers, water sprouts, and bearded seed heads that detract from the uniform appearance of the landscape. The Bidder may utilize approved herbicides to assist in eradication (refer to Herbicide section).

Removal of Debris / Site Sanitation:

During each monthly service cycle, the Bidder shall perform comprehensive site sanitation and debris removal across all areas covered under this contract. This responsibility includes the systematic collection and disposal of all natural debris—specifically grass cuttings, cleared vegetation, fallen tree limbs, dry brush, and organic matter that may create rodent habitats—as well as the removal of dead animals and all man-made debris. All identified or

generated waste must be cleared and hauled away from the site within 24 hours of the scheduled service completion. All such materials must be transported to an authorized off-base location for disposal in strict accordance with existing local, state, and federal regulations.

Herbicide:

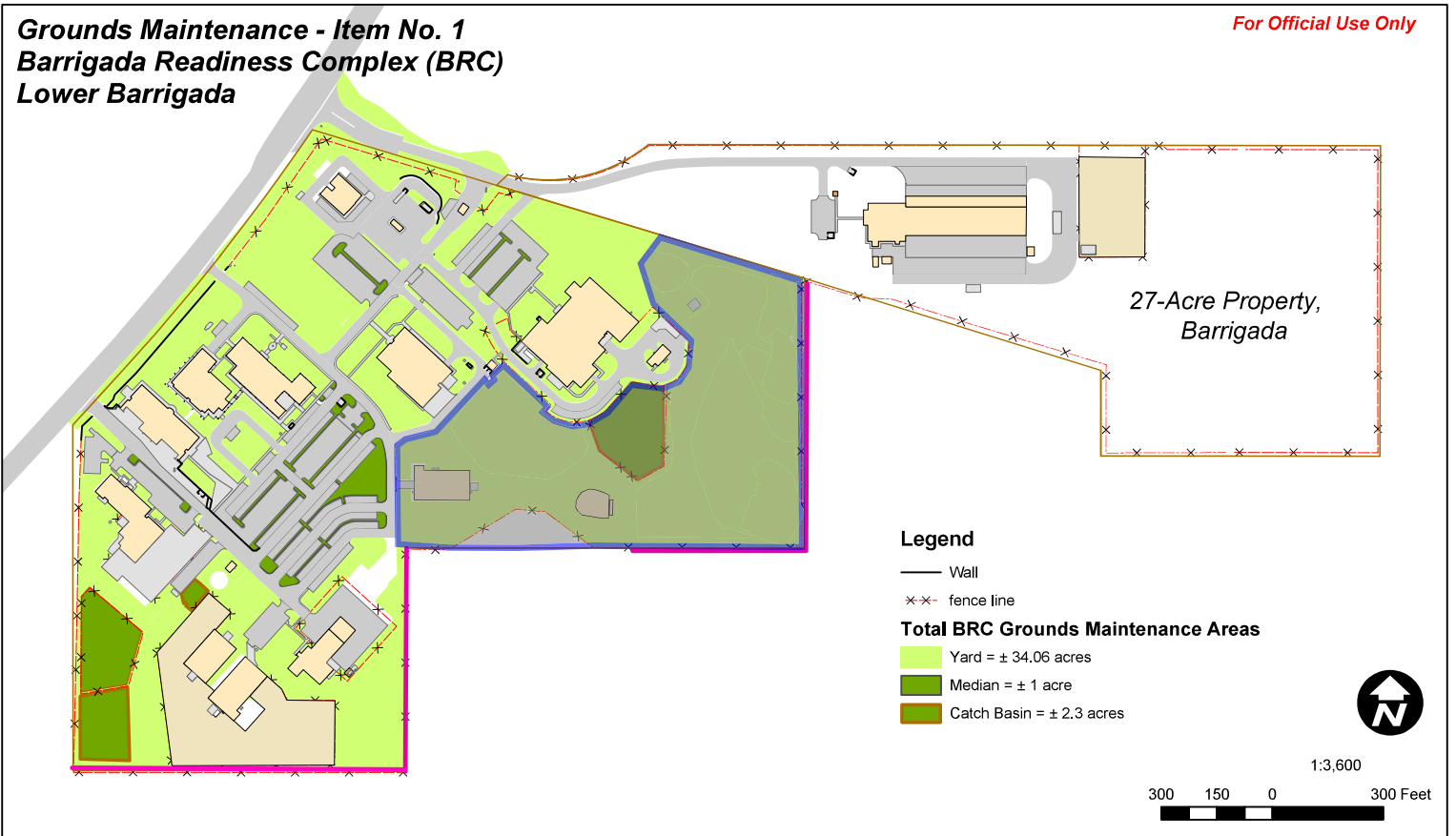
The Bidder shall provide monthly professional herbicide application services to control, suppress, or eliminate unwanted vegetation and weeds through the use of licensed and certified technicians. Services must include both pre-emergent and post-emergent treatments to proactively manage growth and maintain a weed-free environment for the entire duration of the contract. To ensure safety and prevent chemical drift, applications shall only be conducted when wind speeds are below 10 mph and when no precipitation is present or forecasted within four hours of treatment. All operations must strictly adhere to safety compliance standards and comply with all applicable local, state, and federal guidelines and manufacturer labels. Prior to the commencement of any chemical application, the Bidder must submit Safety Data Sheets (SDS) and a list of active ingredients for all proposed herbicides for Government approval. Bidder is required to submit monthly reports to the DMA for review, detailing the specific chemicals used, application rates, and areas serviced.

Grounds Maintenance - Item No. 1 Barrigada Readiness Complex (BRC) Lower Barrigada

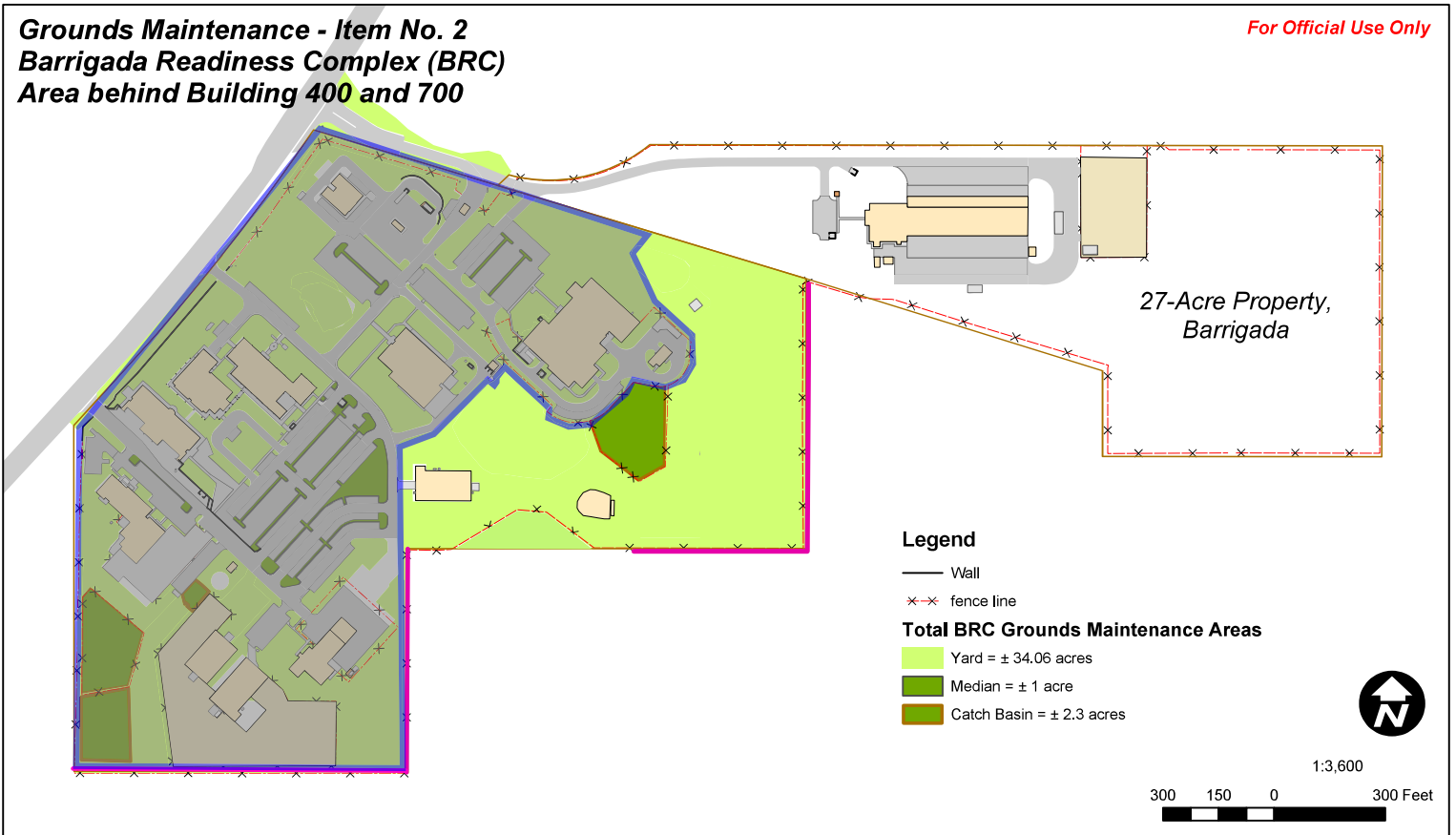
